Victor And Note G



Note G is named after an algorithm developed by Ada Lovelace. Lovelace's algorithm is widely credited as the first one to be written for a mechanical general-purpose computer. Consequently, she is widely regarded as the first computer programmer. Notably, Lovelace's Note G served the purpose of calculating Bernoulli numbers.

Taking inspiration from this, my piece employs spectral shaping and general manipulations of a sonic object through values taken from various Taylor series expansions of the tangent and hyperbolic tangent functions. The piece is premised upon establishing a broader architectural landscape through the emphasis of these transformations over time, yet asserting the presence of a singular spectral object. The soundworld of this piece is centred on calm and refreshing sonorities.



What we do

Our mission is to set a new standard for art music events in Boorloo/Perth through championing and platforming underrepresented musicians and creators while providing inclusive spaces where art music is welcoming and accessible.

Through thoughtful programming and engaging events, we're aiming to set a standard for a future where we no longer need to exist.

Our inaugural concert, held on International Women's Day 2020, was a sellout and featured a range of art and contemporary musicians from Barbara Strozzi to an a cappella composition by Julia Nicholls. In partnership with the UWA Conservatorium of Music, we donated all profits to Dress for Success Perth.

We reemerged in 2021 with Ugly Beauty, a concert celebrating talented women composers of 200 years ago who's careers and memories have been undermined by history. This concert focused on the 200th birthday of Pauline Viardot and contained many Australian premieres, as we paid homage to some of the first women who were able to successfully create composition careers for themselves, and the precedent for future generations that they set.

We believe we can create an artistic space where everyone is supported, inspired, and included. This means advocating for composers regardless of gender, race, ethnicity, sexuality, age, or disability.

We believe in educating our audiences on the past, present, and future of all underrepresented composers. We strive to celebrate them and tell their stories.
